for His specific purpose, and that they are His specific or chosen people. Perhaps we could answer this by asking for specific passages of scripture to support such. There are scriptures in the Word of God that point out the opposite (Rom. 10:12; 1 Cor. 12:13; Gal. 3:28,29; Eph. 2:14-16; Acts 10:34). Salvation is to "*whosoever will*" (Rev. 3:20) from wherever (Mark 16:15).

NO MEDIATOR

Jews are taught to pray directly to God. They don't believe in there being a mediator between God and man. However, when I read 1 Timothy 2:5, I find out Paul says there is a mediator today between God and man and that man is Christ Jesus. Paul believed in such a mediator, for he thanked God through Jesus Christ (Rom. 1:8). Compare these other passages (Col. 3:17; Eph. 5:20). The Jews did not have Jesus as their mediator under the Old Testament before He came. However, He is now here, and He is now to be our mediator. I would to God that lews could see and accept Him as such. However, they will not until they accept the Christ and His word, the New Testament.

CONCLUSION

Those of the Jewish faith fail to understand these important truths. The first step in all of these areas is the accepting of the New Testament as a part of the Word of God. Until Jews accept the New Testament they have no basis to come out from the error in the remaining 6 errors. Today, in order for a Jew to be right and be saved is to turn from these errors. Romans 10:1-3.

"Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel, and with the house of Judah:"

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7 Errors of Jewish Doctrine

The Jewish Religion is still very prominent today. Here is a list of 7 things among many that Jews today believe that are in error according to the Bible.

NO CHRIST YET

One of the most amazing things that came out of the discussions with my new boss was the fact that he did not believe Iesus of Nazareth written about in the New Testament was the Christ.. There were several passages that I would come back to that pointed out Iesus of Nazareth was and is the Christ. In Matthew 1:16-25 the Bible says Jesus Christ HAS BEEN BORN. His virgin birth was the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy (Isa. 7:14). He could not aswer this passage but only point to some future fulfillment. The saviour (Luke 2:11) has been born, and all who desire to be saved must come to God by Him (John 14:6: Acts 4:12). Our failure to believe that Iesus Christ is the Son of God insures death in sin (John 8:24) and therefore, exclusion from heaven (Rev. 21:27)

REJECT THE NEW TESTAMENT

Jews have no problem in rejecting Jesus as the Christ because they flat out rejected the New Testament as being a part of God's word! They will accept the Old Testament as there law but would not call it Old. Really this came as no surprise to me since if one is going to reject Jesus as the Christ the Son of God you would of necessity reject what substantiates His claim of being the Son of God. The Old Testament said it would be replace by a new covenant (Jer. 31:31-34). The New Testament is the fulfillment of that prophecy (Heb. 8:6-13). We are now living under the New Covenant (2 Cor. 3; Heb. 9:15-17; Gal. 5:4). Christ's words, not those of Moses, will judge all from the cross to the end (John 1248; Col. 2:14-16).

SABBATARIANS

Most Jews are devout keepers of the Sabbath Keepers, Sabbatarians. This again, is of no surprise for the simple fact that if you reject the New Testament as the Word of God one would keep the Sabbath. The day of worship under the Old covenant was the Sabbath (Ezek. 20:8-11). That day was also kept during the earthly ministry of Jesus which was under the Mosaical age (Mark 6:2). However, the law of Moses was abolished (2 Cor. 3), and that included the Sabbath day (Ezek. 20:8-11). We are no longer judged with respect to the Sabbath day(s) (Col. 2:14-16). The first day of the week is our day of worship (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 16:2; Rev. 1:10; John 20:19; Matt. 28:1).

OBSERVE FEASTS

Those of the Jewish faith still observe feasts kept under the law. A few examples, Passover (Ezek. 12:1ff), Purim (Esther 9:23ff), Pentecost (Lev. 23:9-21), and others. Jews under the law were perfectly right in keeping these feasts. However, with the fulfillment of the law came the end of the feasts (Col. 2:14-16). The Apostle Paul made it clear that we are no longer to be judged with respect to such things. He also expressed fear of having preached in vain to some who continued to observe days, times, months, and years (Gal. 4:10,11).

MEN'S COVERINGS

All Jewish men are required to wear a covering when they worshiped. Yet the Bible tells us in 1 Corinthians 11:4 "every man praying or prophesying having his head covered, dishonoureth his head." One can read the context and see why God said this. For example, see verses 3,7-9. Jewish men will go on violating God's will in this manner until they accept and obey the New Testament as God's will for man today.

ZIONISTS

Jews believe the establishment of Israel as a nation was according to God's plan. They disagree on some points, but generally agree that the Messiah will use Israel
